#### Course Syllabus Youth Entrepreneurs Mrs. Bailey Pansophia Academy

## • <u>Course Description</u>

 Youth Entrepreneurs teaches free enterprise fundamentals through hands-on experiences. It encourages students like yourselves to start their own business and enhance their business skills for future career opportunities. Students engage critical thinking skills as they iterate business models to launch a one-day pop-up business, and explore how freedom, individual responsibility, property rights, entrepreneurial thinking, and free markets contribute to moral, intellectual, and economic development. YE graduates' involvement is maintained through the alumni program and YE2, which promotes continued learning opportunities and community service.

## • <u>Course Objectives</u>

• This course examines the values, ideas, and institutions that create the conditions for Principled Entrepreneurship, financial literacy in business, innovation, leadership, and citizenship to flourish. By the end of the course, you will create value for yourselves and others by applying the entrepreneurial mindset to your life and work, and discover an understanding of self through the history of individuals within cultural institutions and civil society.

## • Evaluation

 You are graded mostly on participation as YE is an activity-heavy and project-based class and as such, it is difficult for you to make up an activity or project they missed due to absences. Participation in class is an absolute requirement and the failure to do so results in the loss of participation points and you could potentially be removed from the class.

## <u>Retakes/Correctives</u>

- Late Work:
